

Vaccination Reactions / Vaccine Damage

From the Homeopathic Practice of Dr. Joachim-F. Grätz, Germany

1. "Lighter" Disorders/Damage	
Tendency to infections	fever attacks, recurrent/persistent cough and cold, pseudocroup, (spastic) bronchitis, middle ear infection, tonsillitis, sinusitis, frontal sinusitis, pneumonia, tubal catarrh, tympanic effusion, urinary tract infections, prostatitis, antibody deficiency syndrome, etc.
Gastro-intestinal complaints	tendency to diarrhea/ emetic diarrhea, tendency to (daily) vomiting
Skin rashes	neurodermatitis, psoriasis, tendency to urticaria (hives), ichthyosis (fish scale disease)
Allergies	such as hay fever (pollen, grass, cows milk, food, animal hair, sun, cold, chemicals, swimming pool, etc.), gluten intolerance, allergic asthma, allergic neurodermatitis, etc.
Bronchial asthma	
Bedwetting / defecating	
Failure to thrive (infants)	lack of appetite, moderate weight gain, coeliac disease
MCD	minimal cerebral dysfunction (minimal brain damage): Perceptual disorders of all kinds, ADD, ADHD, hyperactivity, developmental retardation (e.g. late learning to walk/speak), (panic) fears, coordination disorders (e.g. tendency to trip, gross/fine motor ineptitude), concentration disorders, lack of interest, slowing down, learning difficulties, hyperactivity. (e.g. tendency to trip, gross/fine motor clumsiness), concentration disorders, lack of interest, deceleration, learning difficulties, dyslexia, dyscalculia, RAWD (reading and writing disorder), chronic fatigue, behavioral abnormalities, "class clowns", erethism, aggressiveness, violence, intelligence defects, one-sided giftedness, auditory processing and perception disorder.
Pfeiffer's glandular fever	infectious mononucleosis (Epstein-Barr virus)
Sleeping problems	difficulty falling asleep, difficulty sleeping through the night, nocturnal fears, nightmares, hours of unmotivated shrill crying, reversal of the day-night rhythm, etc.
Rheumatic complaints	rheumatism, polyarthritis, VERA (very early rheumatoid arthritis)
Bechterew's disease	ankylosing spondylitis, chronic inflammatory rheumatic disease of the axial skeleton (spine, sacroiliac joints, pubic symphysis, small vertebral joints), the joints of the extremities and tendon insertions
Eye complaints	myopia, strabismus, astigmatism, macular degeneration, Coats' disease (exudative retinal detachment in adolescence), glaucoma already as a child

Hormone disorders	dwarfism (short stature), excessively rapid growth in length, inguinal testicles, retractile testis, regression of the scrotum to a skin fold in infancy, menstrual disorders of all kinds, amenorrhea, unfulfilled desire to have children, pregnancy problems or complications, miscarriages, premature births, stillbirths, hirsutism (increased body/facial hair in girls and women), nodular hardening of the breast. Addison's disease, prolactinoma
Sexual disorders	loss of libido, erection problems, impotence, slowed/inadequate sperm motility, reduced sperm density, severe menstrual cramps, sterility
Hair loss	(massive) diffuse hair loss, alopecia areata (circular hair loss), alopecia (baldness due to increased hair loss), alopecia totalis (total hair loss, also in women)
Weight loss / obesity	
Muscle cramps	muscle cramps, muscle soreness and muscle twitching, muscle stiffness
Migraine	
Hearing impairment	
Olfactory impairment	
Dental decay	caries, root inflammation; black decaying milk teeth
Cardiac arrhythmia	
Cystic fibrosis	allegedly hereditary metabolic disorder resulting in a generalized dysfunction of exocrine glands
Fatigue syndrome	CFS (chronic fatigue syndrome), burnout syndrome (state of chronic exhaustion with reduced performance capacity)
Circulatory disorders	circulatory weakness, dizziness, tendency to faint/collapse
Mental disorders	depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder, nervous tics (e.g. counting tics but also throat-clearing, coughing or spluttering tics, blinking spasms, lip biting or licking; in children also as a transient phenomenon), anxiety disorders with panic attacks, fear for relatives, exaggerated fear of misfortune/disease/infection/bacteria/cancer; narcissism, narcissistic personality disorder (profound personality disorder with lack of self-esteem, strong sensitivity to criticism and little empathy, alternating with conspicuous self-admiration, exaggerated vanity and exaggerated outward self-confidence [arrogant, overbearing behavior] to compensate for low self-esteem); gaslighting (special type of psychological terror, systematic distortion of facts, including lies, denials and intimidation tactics, with the aim of making the victim doubt his own sanity and mental health, so that he can no longer distinguish between truth and appearance)

2. "Serious" Disorders/Damage

Thrombocytopenia	sometimes life-threatening tendency to bleed due to a lack of platelets
Autoimmune diseases	autoimmune hemolytic anemia (a certain type of severe anemia), Hashimoto's thyroiditis (thyroid disease), systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE)
Poliomyelitis	so-called polio; ... through oral polio vaccination!
Marfan's syndrome	allegedly hereditary generalized connective tissue disease, characterized by slender, overlong tubular bones (tall stature) and hyperextensibility of the joints, by changes in the cardiovascular system and the eyes; especially in the eyes; malformations and anomalies of the cornea, subluxation (incomplete luxation) or dislocation of the lenses, possibly with slippage of the iris, possibly spherical lens, myopia, glaucoma, retinal detachment, narrow pupils
Epilepsy	infantile spasms (an epilepsy manifestation in toddlers often combined with progressive mental decline, namely as a lightning-fast movement of the body with forward throwing of the arms and legs [lightning spasm], as a forward bending of the torso [propulsive petit mal], as a head tilt and bringing the arms together in front of the chest [salaam spasms]), grand mal seizures, focal convulsions, status epilepticus, Rolando's epilepsy, myoclonia (muscle cloni), absences, pyknolepsy (absence seizures)
Raptus attacks	sudden onset of agitation as a symptom of a deeply rooted mental disorder, e.g. in severe depression or schizophrenia; possibly even exhibiting destructive and homicidal behavior
Spasticity	spasmodically increased muscle tone
Paralysis	hemiparesis (incomplete paralysis of one half of the body), swallowing paralysis
Muscular hypotension	weakness of the arms and legs, sometimes only on one side
Muscular atrophy	regression of muscle tissue
Duchenne's muscular dystrophy	allegedly genetic muscle disease with pathological remodeling of the tissue and significant dysfunction
Multiple sclerosis	MS, primary inflammatory disease of the central nervous system (CNS)
Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis	ALS, progressive degenerative disease of the spinal cord with muscle atrophy and flaccid paralysis
Friedreich's ataxia	cerebellar-spinal cord disease with progressive atrophy of the posterior cords and the spinal cord-cerebellar pathways with subsequent movement disorders
Stiff-man syndrome	very rare disease, usually occurring in middle-aged men, with progressive, persistent trunk and limb stiffness and paroxysmal tetaniform, very painful muscle spasms with fractures, dislocations and contractures as sequelae; often associated with autoimmune diseases, including diabetes mellitus or neoplasia (autonomous tissue neoplasia)

Dissociative disorders	summarizing term for various disorders of mental functions (e.g. consciousness, memory), one's own feelings and bodily sensations (e.g. pain, hunger, thirst, fear), perception of oneself and/or the environment and control of body movements
Contact behavior disorders	autism, Asperger's syndrome, elective mutism
Diabetes mellitus type I	DMT 1, juvenile insulin-dependent diabetes
Degenerative diseases	e.g. hepatic sarcoidosis, atypical Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis
Mucopolysaccharidosis	collective term for allegedly hereditary metabolic disorders
"Brain tumor"	
Hypersensitivities	e.g. MCS (multiple chemical sensitivity)
Polyneuropathy	systemic inflammatory and degenerative disease of the peripheral nerves with discomfort such as: "severe tingling, ants running, severe nerve pain in the legs, pain as if someone were running a lighter up and down under the skin, as if your legs were burning off"
Memory disorders	memory problems, ... in old age then dementia, Alzheimer's disease
Diseases of the inner ear	progressive sensorineural hearing loss, deafness, balance disorders, spinning vertigo, frequent persistent dizziness up to permanent vertigo due to labyrinth failure
Renal failure	acute renal failure, chronic renal insufficiency, nephrotic syndrome
Mental disorders	severe depression with suicidal tendencies, manic depression, bipolar affective disorder, psychosis, borderline syndrome (psychiatric clinical picture on the borderline between neurosis, psychosis and severe character disorder), schizophrenia, paranoid syndrome with anxiety, hearing voices, logorrhea; running amok (mass murder or attempted mass murder in a fit of paranoia, in which the perpetrator accepts the risk of being killed himself)

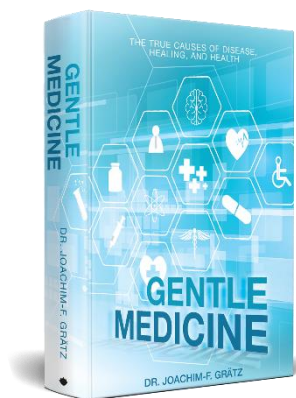
3. "Most Severe" Disorders/Damage

Louis-Bar syndrome	chronic progressive cerebellar ataxia (with cerebellar atrophy)
Leukodystrophy	progressive degeneration of the white matter (medullary sheaths) of the central nervous system (CNS), diffuse demyelination of the brain, myelin destruction [referred to as infantile, juvenile and adult cerebral sclerosis (due to glial proliferation)], later progressive spastic quadriplegia, also speech loss, hearing impairment, difficulty swallowing, fatal in a few years
Tuberous brain sclerosis	also known as tuberous sclerosis: progressive disease of the brain and skin beginning in childhood with formation of coarse ("sclerotic") nodules in the cerebral and cerebellar cortex and numerous calcifying tumors of the cerebral ventricles; also multiple angiofibromas in the face, nail fold fibromas, rhabdomyomas of the heart, mixed tumors of the kidneys and "white spots" (hypopigmentation of the skin), epilepsy and progressive mental retardation
Holoprosencephaly	severe malformations of the brain and face with mostly severe mental disability
Microcephaly	pathological reduction in the circumference of the skull
Quadriplegia	tetraplegia; complete paralysis/spasticity of all four extremities
West syndrome	hypsarrhythmia (severely pathological EEG with diffuse mixed convulsive potentials), jackknife seizures, salaam convulsions, severe psychomotor developmental disorders (mental and motor disability), overall unfavorable prognosis, which is essentially determined by the type of underlying encephalopathy
Lennox-Gastaut syndrome	in infantile epileptic diffuse encephalitis, seizures with slow, diffuse spike/wave complex in the EEG; combination of drop seizures, nocturnal tonic seizures and myoclonic twitches; allegedly genetically determined early childhood brain damage
Dravet's syndrome	early infantile epileptic encephalopathy; a rare, severe and malignant form of myoclonic epilepsy in early childhood
Tourette's syndrome	compulsions, tics; strict general extrapyramidal-motor disorder with lightning-like twitches mainly in the facial area (eye blinking, mouth distortion, tongue clicking), but also in the neck (jerky head turns) and shoulders (skidding); possibly increased to a choreatic storm of movement; associated with compulsive actions; maladie des tics
Rett's syndrome	early childhood onset and slowly progressive encephalopathy (e.g. brain atrophy); with dementia, autistic behavior, stereotypies, retarded head growth, later with epileptic seizures, muscle atrophy and spasticity
Ohtahara's syndrome	severe early childhood epileptic encephalopathy with muscular hypotonia
Guillain-Barré syndrome	usually symmetrically arranged flaccid paralysis, initially of the legs with weakening of reflexes, paresthesia or absence of all or individual reflexes. Possible sensory disturbances and pain, which can progress (usually within a few days) to tetraplegia (paralysis of all four extremities). This may result in muscle atrophy and the risk of respiratory paralysis.

Chorea	"St. Vitus' dance"; an extrapyramidal movement disorder with rapid, involuntary contractions of individual, alternating muscles or muscle groups in almost all regions of the body ("choreatic hyperkinesis", in mild cases only clumsy and fax-like in appearance)
NCL - Neuronal ceroid lipofuscinosis	allegedly hereditary lipid storage disease with electron microscopically visible ceroid lipofuscin pigment inclusions in the lysosomes of all organs and neurodegeneration; form of progressive myoclonus-epilepsy syndromes with central movement disorder, dementia and (usually) blindness
Multiple disabilities	... up to slowly progressive, extremely severe, persistent skeletal deformities, motor disabilities; possibly associated with mental retardation and organ failure
Fatalities	SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome); SADS (Sudden Arrhythmic Death Syndrome, Sudden Adult Death Syndrome; sudden, unexpected death in adolescents/adults due to cardiac arrest [often fatal complication after vaccination with C vaccines]); VITT (Vaccine-induced Immune Thrombotic Thrombocytopenia, vaccine-induced immune thrombotic thrombocytopenia; vaccine-induced bleeding tendency associated with micro blood clot formation [often fatal complication after vaccination with C vaccines])



Please note: ➤ Vaccinations can cause genetic defects!



Classification of health disorders/damage

The classification into "Lighter", "serious" and "most severe disorders" is arbitrary and is based on the remaining quality of life of the individual and their caring relatives. It results from the cases in homeopathic practice. Of course, the boundaries are fluid; in individual cases the clinical pictures can also be more or less pronounced/weak, so that they would then have to be classified differently in some cases, depending on the degree of severity. - For example, "autism" (here: severity level 2) can often also be found in the form of a severe disorder (category 3).
